




Love and Loss in Port Macquarie Penal Settlement Forgotten women, unforgettable stories Part of the broader Forget-Me-Not Project to identify the female convicts sent to Port Macquarie, this book follows the release of Rowdy Voices & Quiet Whispers in 2024. Tangled Lives has stories of another 36 women and includes the men who walked beside them. Their tales of resilience, quiet courage, love, loyalty and heartbreak, of survival against the odds in an unfamiliar land are drawn from official records. Remembered not just as convicts, but as people seeking companionship, love and dignity wherever they could find it. Because their lives mattered - and their voices deserve to be heard...
